What

How

Where

Lanesville Community Center, 8 Vulcan Street, Gloucester, MA, about one hour north of Boston. The Community Center—handicapped accessible—is located within a half mile of a community beach, a working harbor, hiking and walking trails, and lots of natural beauty.

How to Get There

We are hoping people will carpool, and we'll facilitate that process. The Commuter Rail will be out of service this summer to attend to infrastructure repairs and federal safety mandates.

How Much

Free! First Literacy will cover the costs of the retreat, including healthy morning snacks and lunch.

Lenore Balliro, Director of Programs at First Literacy, and guest facilitators trained in mind/body practices and expressive arts. Participants will be encouraged to contribute their creative expertise!

What is the Selection Process

The retreat is for ABE/ESOL teachers only. We will consider people who both teach and direct a program. Only two teachers per program are eligible to attend. We will try to balance geography, new/experienced teachers, and type of program. We are limiting the number to 20 participants, and we will maintain a waiting list.
