Calculate average of percentage

We need to first convert the percentage to an equivalent decimal to do our calculation. Converting a percentage to a decimal we remove the percentage sign and divide by 100. Converting **10%** to a decimal; **10%** = $(10/100) = 0.10$. Then add those decimals and convert totals back to percentages by multiplying by 100.

Ex.- $28\% + 26\% + 13\% = .28 + .26 + .13 = .67 = .67/3 = .223 = 22.3$ percent for an average of percentages. Of course some students will point out that you can simply add the percentages without conversion (in this case, yes, in most cases no...and depending on your depth of math knowledge, you can talk about “weighted averages...”

Weighted averages would take into account total number percentages are taken from (populations vary from state to state, so 10% from a populous state is very different than 10% from a state with far fewer people.)

Smoking: State-By-State Ranking

Here are the state-by-state smoking rates -- that is, the percentage of adults who currently smoke every day or some days. Note that the CDC does not rank states; rank order was determined by WebMD on the basis of the CDC data for each state's total smoking rate.
