- A Google product that facilitates interaction between teachers and students (similar to Blackboard or Canvas)
- With Google Classroom, you can easily:
 - Communicate with students
 - Share materials with your class
 - Keep track of assignments and grades
 - Assign homework, group projects, and individual assignments

Joining a Class

- How do students join? Either send them an invitation or have them go to **classroom.google.com** and enter a code.
- For today, go to the address above and click on the “+” in the top right corner. Click on “**Join class**” and enter the code **p34s2g5**.

Google Classroom from a Student's Perspective

- Click on “**Sample Question.**” Type your response under “**Your answer**” (on the right), then click “**Turn in.**”
- Click on “**See classmate answers**” and reply to other people’s responses.







Google Classroom from a Student's Perspective

- Next, go back to the “Stream” page by clicking on the class name (“**Doing More with Google**”) in the top left corner.
- Click on “**Sample Assignment.**” Follow the instructions to complete the assignment. Be careful – you may be graded on this! 😊



Google Classroom from a Student's Perspective

- Again, go back to the Stream by clicking on “**Doing More with Google**” in the top left corner. Click on “**Share something with your class...**” 
- Think of an online resource that you would recommend to other teachers. Click on the link icon, copy and paste the link, then click “**Add link.**” 

Google Classroom from a Student's Perspective

- Click on “**Share with your class**” and write a brief description of the resource. When you’re finished, click “**Post.**”
- Reply to other people’s ideas by clicking on “**Add class comment...**” and typing your responses.

Discuss with one or two partners:

1. How do you think your students would benefit from using Google Classroom?
2. How much of a learning curve do you think there would be for your students? What specific challenges would they face?

Google Classroom from a Teacher's Perspective

- In Classroom, go to “Classes” (click on the three lines in the top left corner) and click on “+” to create a class.
- You will need to agree to the message that pops up. Then choose a name for your class (e.g., “Andrew’s Class”).
- Click on “People” at the top, then find “Students.” You can either click on the icon to invite them by email or give them a code to join. Have at least two other workshop participants join your class.



Google Classroom from a Teacher's Perspective

- Go to “Classwork” at the top, then click the “Create” button. Choose “Question.”
- Type a question inspired by a recent challenge you’ve faced in your classroom or at your program. Click on the blue “Ask” button.
- Respond to questions by other teachers (whose classes you’re in) by typing your answer as before.

Google Classroom from a Teacher's Perspective

- Go back to your own class and click on “**Classwork**” again. Click on “**Create**” and choose “**Quiz assignment**.”
- Choose a title for your quiz, then click on “**Blank Quiz**” at the bottom.
- In Google Forms, create at least one question. Click on “**Answer key**” to indicate the correct answer.
- When you’re done, return to your assignment in Google Classroom and click “**Assign**.”

Talk about it!



Discuss with one or two partners:

1. What kind of assignments, questions, quizzes, etc. could you create and share using Google Classroom?
2. What’s your overall reaction to Google Classroom after learning about it today? Are you impressed? Confused? Interested in exploring more?



Google Drive

- A home for all of your Google files: Docs, Sheets, Forms – Classroom, too!
- “My Drive” is the name of your main folder, and Classroom files are automatically stored in a subfolder.
