# What does a Volunteer Teacher do?

- Teach English to a class of 2-6 Asian immigrant/refugee women for 1.5 hours a week for one semester.
- Use the ESOL text provided by the program.
- Prepare a written lesson plan and worksheets and flashcards each week.
- Maintain attendance and other records as requested.

# What skills and personal qualities does a Volunteer Teacher need?

- Completion of at least one semester/summer as a paid staff member or a volunteer in an education, human service, or health agency. Experience in teaching is NOT required.
- Verbal and written fluency in English.
- Proficiency in Chinese helpful, but not necessary.
- Cultural sensitivity, personal maturity, warmth, caring, and compassion.

# What are the Volunteer Teacher requirements?

 Availability for 3 hours a week, beginning the week of September 12<sup>th</sup>. Must be available during <u>one</u> of these time blocks:

Mondays 11:30 AM to 1:00 PM Tuesdays 10:30 AM to 12:00 Noon <u>or</u> 12:30-2:00 PM Thursdays 11:30 AM to 12:45 PM

• Availability to attend three 2-hour pre-service training sessions and two volunteer meetings over the semester.
