Description

Learn or improve English pronunciation & listening skills with a new sound- and phonogram-based method


This audio-visual deck (recorded by a native American English speaker) will help anyone learn or improve

- English pronunciation & reading skills and
- English listening skills

English is made up of 42 distinct sounds. You need to learn those sounds so you can comprehend what you hear. You need to pronounce those sounds so you can be understood. The written letters that make different sounds are called phonograms. This deck demonstrates 56 different phonograms that make most English words.

Here is an example phonogram -- 'th' makes two sounds:





English can be hard to understand or to pronounce correctly for two reasons:

- most sounds that you hear spoken can be written different ways that have different meanings
- 2) most letters (phonograms) that you read have more than one possible pronunciation

Example 1) You hear the word /sʌn/ -- is it sun or son? You hear the word /bɹeik/ -- is it break or brake?

Example 2) The letters 'ea' make 3 different distinct sounds (i ϵ ei) in these three words:



With this deck you practise hearing and speaking English using words and phrases that occur very often in English. After you have worked through this deck, you will be able to

- learn new words faster because you can pronounce them better
- understand spoken and written English better because you recognise the sounds in the words, and the words from the sounds
- recognize and use a starting vocabulary of 900 words
- understand the basic rules of English pronunciation and spelling

This deck has 45 minutes of audio divided into 780 replayable files.

- When you finish this deck, you will be ready to read English on your own.
- When you read a new word, you will have a very good idea how to pronounce it.
