# Padlet

- Shared bulletin boards on which students can add text, photos, drawings, videos, audio recordings, and more
- Free account: 3 (ish) padlets, which you can clear and reuse as often as you want
- Paid account (\$10/month or \$96/year): unlimited padlets

# Creating a padlet

- Format types
- Title, wallpaper, font, and other settings
- Types of posts
- Let's practice!



# Things to remember

- Adding names (unless anonymous)
- Editing posts
- “Require Approval” enables private posts
- Comments allow for discussion and feedback (visible to all); private feedback can be through WhatsApp, email, etc.
- Clearing posts and deleting a padlet
- Other settings
- Padlet app required for some features on a phone





# Group activity

For Google Forms and Quizizz, everyone in the group should suggest at least one question to add to the assessment. For Padlet, after deciding on a question/prompt, everyone should add at least one post.

# Nearpod

- Interactive lessons that incorporate various kinds of content and activities
- Lessons can be live or student-paced (like Quizizz)
- Free account offers all types of content and activities; paid plans start at \$120/year, offering more storage and other features
