





Born in Boston in 1706, Benjamin Franklin helped to draft the Declaration of Independence and the U.S. Constitution, and he negotiated the 1783 Treaty of Paris, which ended the Revolutionary War. His scientific pursuits included investigations into electricity, mathematics and mapmaking. A printer and writer known for his wit and wisdom, Franklin was a polymath who published *Poor Richard's Almanack*, invented bifocal glasses and organized the first successful American lending library. *Poor Richard's Almanack* was popular for witty phrases coined in the work, some of which still survive in the contemporary American vernacular
