Who has a self-care practice they find inspiring? Tell about it	Who has read a book or article recently that they would recommend? What and why?	Who enjoys teaching others about food and cooking from their country of origin? Favorite dish or technique?
Who has ever repaired a car, torn clothing, household appliance? How did it go?	Who plays or played on a sport team? Tell about a strong memory or learning experience.	Who has slept 'under the stars'? Where and when?	Who plays a musical instrument or enjoys singing?
