

#### **Explicitly Teaching a Learning Strategy**

- 1. Choose a strategy you use often in class.
- 2. Name the strategy. Ex: Flashcards
- 3. Establish the strategy in your class agenda.
- 4. Reflect: After a using a strategy, ask:

  What did we just do? What are the steps?

  Do you like this strategy? Why? Why not?
- 5. Apply: When assigning independent work, ask:

Will you use this at home? In what situations?

How are you practice the \_\_\_\_\_? What strategies will help you learn this?



Step #2: Highlight your mistakes.


**Step #3:** Write the correct answer next to each mistake.

Step #4: If you do not understand the correction, ask someone for help.

- 5. Check your work.


